The quiet André Kientzler is now helped by his son, Eric, in the running of their small 13.8 hectares estate which include vineyards in 3 Grand Crus of Ribeauvillé. Their style remains unique, displaying André's craft and experience with wines that mirror his calm and unassuming character. They are very fine with underlying purity and intense mineral notes. The Rieslings are like crystal, gaining great complexity over the years. Do not expect big showy wines here, just wines that are classy and racy.

## Château Soucherie, Coteaux du Layon, Beaulieu-sur-Layon, Anjou-Saumur

The majestic Château Soucherie's historic 28 hectare estate lies just 20 minutes south of Angers, producing wines from Anjou, Savennières, Coteaux du Layon and Chaume. Owned and run by Pascale and Roger-François Béguinot, their team works with immense care and dedication, guided by respect for the natural balance of the soils and their vines. All of the work of the vineyards is carried out manually: from stripping to budding, canopy management to harvesting. The resulting wines are superb expressions of the authenticity, richness and diversity of their different soils.

The Daviau family have owned vines on the hills surrounding Brissac since 1546. Today, their 50 hectares of vineyards spread over numerous and varied parcels in and around the commune. Following the completion of his wine studies at the University of Bordeaux; Christophe Daviau, heir to the family business, now manages Domaine de Bablut. Due to his great respect for the environment, Christophe committed himself to organic farming. Furthermore, inspired by natural activist Nicolas Joly, Christophe adopts many biodynamic practices too. His philosophy is to create a harmonious balance between terroir and grape variety, which he does with serious aplomb.

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## Les Vins de la Madone, Champdieu, Côtes du Forez (O)

Of all the vineyard regions along the River Loire, Côtes du Forez is closest to the river's source, located on an ancient geological fault line with approximately 100 extinct volcanoes, about 30 of which are located in Côtes du Forez. Owned and run by Gilles Bonnefoy, Les Vins de la Madone comprises 8 hectares in total, a third of which is made up of vines of at least 30 years of age. Gilles' family did not own any vineyards, so by sheer hard work he has assembled his own holdings, with 75% of his vines planted on volcanic soil, including basalts, clays and granites; the rest are grown on clay and granitic soils. Starting out in 1997, he converted to organic farming in 2001 and then biodynamics in 2008. Gilles says "a successful vigneron cannot be afraid of hard work and that he must understand a myriad of disciplines including viticulture, horticulture, wine making science, geology, business, people etc!"

Billaud-Simon is a household name in Chablis. Producing great Chablis for many decades, the estate had reached the very top under the canny management of Bernard Billaud, until 2014 when the highly respected House of Faiveley purchased the estate. The style has always been very precise and minerally driven, yet with great subtlety. The wines can be enjoyed young, especially the Chablis and the Premiers Crus, but they will gain in complexity showing multiple layers of flavour after three or four years in bottle.

Founded by Frédéric Groffier in the 19th Century, Domaine Robert Groffier remains family run with Robert's son Serge and grandson Nicolas now at the helm. Most of the domaine's vineyards are located in Chambolle Musigny, producing powerful, deeply coloured wines, which are true expressions of the terroir.

This fine family-owned domaine, comprising 9 hectares of vines, has been run impeccably since 1995 by Jean-Pierre Charlot, son-in-law of Joseph Voillot, who sadly passed away in July 2014. Over recent years, Jean-Pierre has refined the quality and style of wines produced here. Sustainable viticulture holds sway. He has dispensed with the inclusion of stems as he prefers the essence of fruit, and he has shortened the length of time the wines spend in barrel – typically 14-16 months followed by 1 month in stainless steel prior to bottling. Jean-Pierre has also reduced the percentage of new oak - now 10-20% depending on the cru. He prefers a light filtration but no fining. Volnay 'Vieilles Vignes' is sourced from 8 parcels including: Famines, Gigotte, Pasquier, Grands Poisots and Petits Poisots and totals nearly 2 hectares with an average vine age of almost 50 years. Volnay 1er Cru 'Champans' covers 1.7 hectares with vines dating from 1934, 1971 and 1985. The wine typically has more fruit and power than other Voillot Volnay crus.

## Domaine Darviot Perrin, Monthélie

Didier and Geneviève Darviot are quintessential vigneron; as a husband and wife team they oversee every phase of the winemaking procedure from pruning and ploughing to racking the casks and bottling on their own premises – 'minimal intervention' is key. Working to a fully certified biodynamic philosophy is Didier's aim. Internationally considered one of the finest sources of domaine-bottled Burgundies, their 11 hectares property is one of the very few to own vines in the three top 1er Cru vineyards of Meursault: 'Perrières', 'Genevrières' and 'Charmes'. In addition, they also own vines in Chassagne Montrachet 1er Cru 'Blanchots-Dessus', which abuts Le Montrachet and Criots-Bâtard-Montrachet. Didier is, without doubt, a winemaker of prodigious talent.

# Rhône

Three generations of the family have worked this vineyard in Ampuis at the heart of the Côte-Rôtie. The estate was founded in 1993 by Jocelyne and Yves Lafoy, who cobbled together vines from their respective in-laws to follow in Jocelyne's father's footsteps on the Côte Brune in Côte-Rôtie. Since 2012, the winemaking has been the chief responsibility of their son Gaëtan. Gaëtan was formally trained at a viticulture and oenology school in Mâcon, France and spent a few months at the Plumpton Agricultural College in Sussex in the United Kingdom. Following this, he trained with an internship under Jean-Michel Gérin in Côte-Rôtie. The vineyards are worked by hand (often on steep terraces) with little mechanisation, and the winemaking style is traditional producing ageworthy, structured and elegant wines.

Founded in 1976 by Philippe Laurent and Michèle Aubéry-Laurent, Domaine Gramenon lies in the heart of the Drôme Provençale in Montbrison sur Lez surrounded by 25 hectares of vines and olive groves. The vineyards are planted on a limestone plateau, 300m above sea level, which brings a purity and freshness to the wines. Unfortunately, Philippe passed away as a result of an accident in 1999, so Michèle was joined by her son Maxime-François. Together they aim to keep the identity of each plot of land, which gives birth to their 'cuvées'. Maxime-François has also created a small wine merchant business in partnership with a neighbouring vigneron, whose vineyards are certified organic. He issues and labels his cuvées under his own name.

Françoise Roumieux and her sister Béatrice run this 50 hectares estate together with their brother Didier Mayard producing three separate Châteauneuf du Pape cuvées. Both the cuvée 'Père Pape' and 'Clos du Calvaire' offerings are traditionally made wines from 40 to 50 year-old vines and are aged in neutral 600 litre oak foudres and cement tanks. The 'Crau de ma Mère' is a small cuvée made with 100 year old vines and is only available in limited allocations.

## Château de la Font du Loup, Châteauneuf du Pape

After her father left for Morocco to pursue a new challenge, Anne-Charlotte Mélia took control of the vineyard where she is exploring natural techniques, along with undertaking a complete renovation of the cellar. The future looks bright for her, especially due to her desire to utilise the ancient vines contained within her parcels. The vineyard of Font du Loup (Fountain of the Wolf) is located on the north side of the famous plateau, La Crau. The two lieux-dits, "La Font du Loup" and "La Crau" are in the commune of Courthézon. La Crau is divided between two communes, Courthézon and Bedarrides, but all of Anne-Charlotte's plots are in the northern most part of Courthézon. The Font du Loup area is altogether different in soil, given that it is nearly pure sand, furthermore it is also a north facing and one of the highest altitudes within Châteauneuf-du-Pape, thus contributing to it being one of the coolest climates in the appellation.

Domaine Sant Armettu doesn't use any weed killers or chemical fertilisers, allowing the wines to have real typicity. The vines are planted on terraces along the slopes, in soil of granitic sand and grown traditionally. Under these conditions, the vineyard is enriched by the beneficial influence of sea breezes and natural temperature regulation of the Mediterranean Sea, with the mountain backdrop.

## Château Revelette, Jouques, Côteaux d'Aix-en-Provence

Sheltered by Mount Saint-Victoire and nestled amidst thousands of hectares of wild, unspoiled woodland, lies the secluded Château Revelette. This picturesque estate is owned by German-born Peter Fischer and his wife Sandra, who have one aim: to craft 'real' wines, which are the purest expressions of their stunning terroir. A graduate of UC Davis, California, Peter first moved to Provence with the dream of owning his own vineyard; Revelette now comprises 30ha of land under vine, divided into 17 distinct plots with 11 different grape varieties, which Peter farms organically and follows biodynamic principles. At an altitude of 330m-400m, it has one of the coolest climates of Provence, which slows the ripening of the grapes, resulting in elegant, aromatic wines with unique characters.

The significant elevation of the vineyards as well as the mineral rich soils (slate and granite) ensure that the resulting wines offer marked natural vitality and persistence of expressive flavour. The majority of vines are at least 50 years of age. In total Santa Marta control 30 hectares of vineyard, 12 hectares of their own and 18 hectares worked under contract with local, like-minded growers.

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## Bodegas Rudeles, Peñalba de San Esteban, Ribera del Duero, Castilla y León

The name Rudeles comes from the first few letters of each of the family names of the four owners: Ruperez, del Hoyo and Espinel. They have strived to make the most of their biggest asset, their 90yr old vineyards. Vineyards are located in Peñalba de San Esteban at the eastern end of the DO Ribera del Duero and cover 17 hectares at an altitude of over 900m. Vines are planted on the side of a hill in an array of tiny plots, some of them planted with only 50 vines. Almost all the vines are over 100yrs old, with some planted before the arrival of phylloxera, and all are capable of withstanding the harsh climate. Average annual rainfall is less than 400mm. Weather-wise, the sudden autumn gives way to cold winters, frost is quite common in springtime, but summer is hot with occasional violent thunderstorms. In all, Rudeles own fifty different plots of vineyard, all small, spread across 4 separate zones, each of which is vinified separately. Per vine, production can be as low as just 200 grams of grapes. High-tech winemaking ensures that the fruit of these vineyards is gently handled without over manipulation. The terroir and the bush vines impose that all vineyard tasks are performed manually. In the winery the winemaking process from grape reception, to fermentation, ageing, racking and bottling is strictly controlled.

## Gregorio Martínez, Nalda, La Rioja Alta

The current winery was constructed in time for the 2001 vintage, with grapes sourced from a 120 hectare estate, 40 hectares of which are under vine. Located in the Iregua Valley, between the villages of Nalda, Sorzano & Entrena. The founder of the project was Gregorio Martínez, who started to purchase land around Sorzano, his wife's hometown, in the late 1970's/early 1980's. Currently managed by his descendants, the project changed dramatically following the appointment of head winemaker Ricardo Cantera back in 2009.

A recently introduced range, Finca Gregorio Martínez, includes a clean, vibrant white Viura; a vibrant, pale-coloured rosé made from Tempranillo and a Mazuelo aged in oak for 8 months plus two single-varietal reds crafted from Tempranillo and Mazuelo respectively. Rather unusually the malolactic fermentation takes place in the same tank with skins, resulting in wines that exude a natural freshness.

Pérez Barquero was established back in 1905 within the historic town of Montilla, south of Córdoba and in 1985 the winery was purchased by Rafael Córdoba. Montilla-Moriles is a Spanish DO located in the south of the province of Córdoba and is bounded by 3 rivers Genil to the east, Guadajoz to the west, and Guadalquivir to the north, and the Subbetic Range of mountains to the south.

Pérez Barquero own almost 100 hectares of vineyards, all of which are located on chalky soils in the highest quality zones of the Sierra de Montilla and Moriles Alto. The majority of plantings are Pedro Ximénez (PX), indigenous to the Rin valley. The pressing house is located near the vineyards; as the ambient temperature can reach almost 38°C during harvest, hence maintaining freshness in the grapes is key. It is traditional in Montilla-Moriles to use 6000L amphoras called tinajas, of which Pérez Barquero uses cement tinajas. Fermentation begins in stainless steel tanks, but there is still about 5% residual sugar when the wine is moved to the tinajas. It is here that the wine finishes its alcoholic and malolactic fermentation, and where a layer of flor first develops.

Pérez Barquero's 350 tinajas are stored in a large two storey room with high ceilings and open windows to control the temperatures. The wine ferments on indigenous yeasts; very important in order to fully ferment these high sugar/ high alcohol wines. These natural yeasts develop into the flor which gives these wines their particular character, where after they continue to ferment naturally to 15-16% ABV. The wine then rests in tinajas for one year, from September through to September. After one year the wines are moved to 500L double tapered American oak barrels known as sherry butts. Fino is raised in the solera system in a cooler temperature-controlled cellar than other wines. Oloroso and PX are also raised in a solera system but aged in warmer cellars with a great deal of air contact.

Currently the family farms 10 hectares of organically certified head-pruned vines around La Marina Alta, as well as inland in the Sierra de Salinas mountains. The earthy soils, high elevations, and proximity to the ocean allow the grapes to fully ripen while maintaining very good acidity. The grape varieties are as varied as the climate; Moscatel originates from the lower lying areas close to the ocean whilst Monastrell makes its home in the ungrafted sandy soils of the Sierra de Salinas mountains. Violeta, Felipe and Pilar's talented winemaker daughter, is gradually taking over the reins from her parents. Their approach has always been artisan; natural yeasts are employed for fermentation and no other products are used in the winery except for judicious amounts of sulphur. Soleras are maintained for their highly acclaimed noble sweet wines and based on the direction of Felipe, there will be a bottling periodically with an age designation.

As a result, his innovative work was included in the prestigious "Decanter Magazine Power List" in 2009, 2011 and 2013. José Antonio owns 10 hectares of Albariño vines planted on decomposed granitic soils in the inland subregion of Condado do Tea, close to the Miño River as it flows on its way to the Atlantic. Vineyard work is based on keeping things as natural as possible in order to obtain optimal grapes, supported by minimal intervention winemaking. The focus is "oenology in the field", with precision & attention to detail as key drivers. Only organic fertilizers are used & grasses are often planted between the rows in order to avoid excess of water during winter. Yields are kept deliberately low & long lees contact with extended bottle ageing are José's trademarks. Wines typically rest in stainless steel tanks on their lees for a year before bottling, where they spend another year before release.

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## Bodega Régoa, Amandi, Ribeira Sacra, Galicia

Run by José María Prieto Fernández, Bodega Régoa makes the most of the natural advantages of its geographical situation in the heart of the Amandi sub-region. The winery owns 11 hectares of old vine terraced vineyards, with many south facing slopes, dropping down to the banks of the Sil River. 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## DSG - Vinos David Sampedro Gil, Navarra

DSG is the personal project of a spirited, dynamic oenologist by the name of David Sampedro Gil. David founded his own winery in 2003 producing wines in Navarra and in La Rioja. He displays an intimate knowledge of his vineyards and the soils in one of the higher areas in Rioja Alavesa, based in the small village of Elvillar. Here he produces wines under the DSG Vineyards name, as well as in Navarra, Sierra de Francia (Salamanca), Valencia, and the Mosel! He owns 9 hectares of new and old vineyards (planted between 1915 and 1999) in Elvillar on chalky and chalk-clay soils. These limestone-rich soils, while unable to support other types of agriculture, have been vital in supporting vines and here impart a certain elegance, power and freshness to the grapes. He has been using organic farming methods since 2000, with his 'La Revilla' and 'Tajo' vineyards worked according to Biodynamic tenets. In Navarra, he owns the single vineyard estate of Pasolasmonjas. This whole venture started while he was leisurely wandering around the Sant Martín de Unx area, accompanied by his Australian winemaker friend Dan Standish. Whilst taking a closer look at the plantations of old Garnacha, he became fascinated by the vines he discovered on the slopes and ravines here. When he came across the Pasolasmonjas estate, a project took shape in his mind and he immediately contacted the Coop.

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## Herrero Bodega, Nieva, Segovia, Rueda, Castilla y León

Viñedos de Nieva was founded in 1989 by José María Herrero and his wife Janine Vedel, who acquired 60 hectares of vineyards which were in disarray, having been completely neglected for many years. It took a great deal of effort to restore these vineyards, especially to salvage many older vines of between 100-150 years old. In 2009 the Martue family purchased the bodega, however, in 2010, José María's three sons - José María, Juan Miguel and Javier Herrero Vedel - exercised their option to be bought out and left the winery in the hands of the investor to do what he would with it. With only one vintage lost in the process and the money needed to continue the dream, the Herreros went down the road, literally, and began construction of the Herrero Bodega in 2011. Since the vineyards were never part of the investment deal the vines stayed in the family.

Nieva is famous for its deep, sandy soils with wines produced from the local white grape variety Verdejo, with a thriving winemaking tradition that dates back hundreds of years to the Jeronimo monks. Nieva has a very favourable natural environment for the production of high quality white wines, often considered the 'Grand Cru' of the terroirs of Rueda. With a high altitude of over 850m, Nieva's climate is continental with very cold winters and hot, dry summers, ideal for perfect ripening and lower risk of disease. Most bodegas in Rueda are found in the northern part, where the soil is mostly clay, but here in the southern portion the soil is almost entirely sand with lots of river stones and clay subsoil, providing excellent quality. These sandy soils have literally saved this area from the ravages of phylloxera allowing for old

## Ownership

All goods remain the property of H2Vin Ltd until payment in full has been received for the wine and any other sums owed to H2Vin Ltd. Until title passes, the customer will hold the wine as trustees for H2Vin Ltd. The wine is to be stored securely and is to be easily identifiable as wine supplied by H2Vin Ltd.

## Lien

In circumstances where H2Vin Ltd holds wine on behalf of the customer, the company shall have a right of lien on such wine for any debts, claims and liabilities whatsoever for which you may from time to time be liable to the company whether or not the same is due. The company shall exercise the right of lien at its discretion by the sale of goods and will retain the proceeds towards or to meet all debts, claims and liabilities due or to become due by the customer to the company.

## Payment

Payment is due on placing an order, prior to delivery, except for approved Trade credit accounts when it is due 28 days from invoice date, unless otherwise stated. For approved Trade credit accounts the 1st order must be paid proforma in advance of first delivery, thereafter our normal Trade credit account terms and conditions apply.

## Prices

All prices are per bottle; normal full price on the left column ('full price') and special discounted price on the right column ('discounted'), Duty Paid exclusive of VAT unless stated otherwise. We aim to maintain our prices throughout each 12 month trading period, however, we reserve the right to review our prices whenever pricing increases are enforced outside our control; via 3rd party freight forwarders, UK Logistics, Producers, GB Sterling international exchange rate(s) and UK Chancellor duty tax / Vat increases.

## Deliveries

Delivery is free of charge within the M25 for all orders of a value of £300 or more (excluding VAT) at full Trade List prices. Separate quotes can be given for deliveries South, North and West of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. The minimum order is one standard case (12 bottles, 6 magnums, 3 jéroboams, 24 half bottles or a pro-rata combination thereof).

We can at times offer an 'Emergency Same Day Delivery' service within the M25 for orders placed before 9am. However, please note that same day delivery cannot always be guaranteed. A delivery surcharge will be applicable at the rate enforced by London City Bond at the time of delivery.

## Sale or Return Orders

The 'Sale or Return' service is by prior arrangement and approval only. Please note that rare allocation and premium lines do not apply. All 'Sale or Return' Orders within the M25 must have a minimum value of £300 ex VAT, including Wine, Champagne and/or Fortified Wines. Only 20% of the original order quantity can be returned. All returned goods must be in whole and original unbroken cases and in resaleable condition of the current offered vintage, otherwise no credit will be provided. A minimum collection charge from £15 ex VAT per case (12x75cl) will be applied to all 'Sale or Return' orders. For 'Sale or Return' orders outside of the M25, different minimum order rates apply. Any approved 'Sales or Return' must occur within 7 working days of delivery; thereafter no returns are possible. Please enquire.

## Claims/Risk

All orders must be received physically and signed for at point of confirmed delivery day schedule. If re-delivery has to be rescheduled due to failure to physically received and sign over for your order a re-delivery surcharge will be applied (at cost), with the separate payment required in advance before the re-delivery can be made.

All wine shall be at the buyer's risk from the point of delivery to the buyer. Upon receipt, you must examine the wine delivered and must sign to confirm receipt on the delivery note provided. Shortages, damages or errors must be noted on the proof of delivery note along with notifying H2Vin Ltd immediately at the time of delivery (up to 24 hours) to enable us to support your claim. You must also retain such wine and packaging, making it available for inspection and collection by H2Vin Ltd. Please note that claims made outside of these terms and conditions cannot be guaranteed, as insurance may not cover. Following delivery, client storage areas must be within the minimum grounds of correct temperature control, humidity and hygiene. Our Producers/ Insurance will only guarantee credit assistance cover on faulty wines (TCA/Oxidisation) whilst in our own registered and data calibrated (via telemetry) temperature-controlled storage facilities at London City Bond; thereafter no other 3rd party facilities will be covered, based on unregulated cellar hygiene/ poorly stored/ non calibrated temperature-controlled facilities. You must notify H2Vin Ltd immediately at the time of discovering a faulty bottle (up to 24 hours), with a full explanation of the wines specific technical fault along with the date the bottle was opened, Lot number and cork code to enable us to support your claim.

Where deemed reasonable credit will be provided on faulty goods. Please note that there is a 6-month window cut off period on crediting faulty goods from date of delivery. Each scenario will be evaluated individually. Claims after 6 months can potentially be credited only if we receive credit in return from the original source.

H2Vin will endeavour to ensure all confirmed orders are met, however, if in the unlikely event due to any unforeseen circumstances outside of H2Vin's control, whereby we are unable to fulfil your order (due to producer failure, shortfall in logistics or for any other reason) we will offer you similar wines, or will refund you in full at the original Invoice price without any liability to you.
